PROFESSOR PAUL M DODSON

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Professor Paul Dodson is Director of the Diabetic Retinopathy Screening and Training Centre (HEDRSCE) at Heartlands Hospital, and is Clinical Lead for DR screening at University Hospital, Birmingham. He was appointed Professor in the Department of Life and Health Sciences, Aston University, Birmingham in 2008. His current research interests include diabetic retinopathy, retinal vascular disease and diabetic management.

Paul Dodson trained at Southampton General Hospital and the Royal Berkshire Hospital in Reading, UK and has held academic and clinical appointments at St. Bartholomew's and Moorfields Eye Hospital in London, Dudley Road Hospital (now City Hospital) in Birmingham and Birmingham Heartlands Hospital.
